Office	Incumbent	Qualifications
Superior Court Judge, Office 4	Vacant	A superior court judge must have been an attorney admitted to practice law in California or have served as a judge of a court of record in this state for at least 10 years immediately preceding election or appointment.
Supervisor, District 3	Michael N Kobseff	U.S. citizen, registered voter of the district which the candidate seeks to represent for at least 30 days preceding the deadline for filing nomination documents for the office. Must reside in the district during incumbency. (Gov. Code §§ 24001, 24200, 25041)
Supervisor, District 5	Ray Haupt	U.S. citizen, registered voter of the district which the candidate seeks to represent for at least 30 days preceding the deadline for filing nomination documents for the office. Must reside in the district during incumbency. (Gov. Code §§ 24001, 24200, 25041)
Assessor-Recorder	Craig Kay	A registered voter of the county in which the duties of the office are to be exercised at the time Nomination Papers are issued. (a) No person shall exercise the powers and duties of the office of assessor unless he or she holds a valid appraiser's certificate issued by the State Board of Equalization pursuant to Article 8 (commencing with Section 670) of Chapter 3 of Part 2 of Division 1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. (b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), a duly elected or appointed person may exercise the powers and duties of assessor, for a period not to exceed one year, if he or she acquires a temporary appraiser's certificate from the State Board of Equalization within 30 days of election or appointment. (c) This section shall not apply to any person holding the office of assessor on January 1, 1997. (Elec. Code §13, 13.5; Gov. Code §24001, 24002.5)
Auditor-Controller	Diane Olson	No person shall hereafter be elected or appointed to the office of County Auditor unless the person is a resident and registered voter of the county in which the duties of the office are to be exercised at the time Nomination Papers are issued. (§ I, Ord. 88-4, eff. April 9, 1988, repealed by § I, Ord. 98-01, eff. February 5, 1998 and added by § II, Ord. 98-01, eff. February 5, 1998) (Ord. No. 22-07, § II, 3-29-2022)
County Clerk	Laura Bynum	A registered voter of the county in which the duties of the office are to be exercised at the time Nomination Papers are issued. (Elec. Code §13, 13.5)
Superintendent of Schools	Allan Carver	A registered voter of the county in which the duties of the office are to be exercised at the time Nomination Papers are issued. Must also possess a valid credential from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing; the possession of a valid elementary administrative credential and a valid secondary administrative credential are equivalent to the possession of a valid general administrative credential. DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED THAT VERIFIES CANDIDATE MEETS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS. (Elec. Code §13, 13.5; Gov. Code §24001; Ed. Code §1205-1208)
Treasurer-Tax Collector	Jennifer Taylor	A registered voter of the county in which the duties of the office are to be exercised at the time Nomination Papers are issued. Must also meet one of the following criteria: (1) served in a senior financial management position in a county, city, or other public agency dealing with similar financial responsibilities for a continuous period of not less than three years, including, but not limited to, treasurer, tax collector, auditor, auditor-controller, or the chief deputy or an assistant in those offices. (2) possess a valid baccalaureate, masters, or doctoral degree from an accredited college or university in any of the following major fields of study: business administration, public administration, economics, finance, accounting, or a related field, with a minimum of 16 college semester units, or their equivalent, in accounting, auditing, or finance. (3) possess a valid certificate issued by the California Board of Accountancy pursuant to Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 5000) of Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code, showing that person to be, and a permit authorizing that person to practice as, a certified public accountant. (4) possess a valid charter issued by the Institute of Chartered Financial Analysts showing the person to be designated a Chartered Financial Analyst, with a minimum of 16 college semester units, or their equivalent, in accounting, auditing, or finance. (5) possess a valid certificate issued by the Treasury Management Association showing the person to be designated a Certified Cash Manager, with a minimum of 16 college semester units, or their equivalent, in accounting, auditing, or finance. Continuing education required if elected. These qualifications are in effect only if the Board of Supervisors, by majority vote, enacts an ordinance adopting these provisions.
